

2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a | Psalm 89:2-3, 16-17, 18-19 | Romans 6:3-4, 8-11 | Matthew 10:37-42

The Gospel provides an example of hospitality for all. One would think we would know how to greet the prophet and righteous man, but how do we greet the “little ones?” Do we offer them a glass of water, a cup of coffee, or a meal? We know what it is like to drive by a man with a homeless sign or walk by someone without seeing them. In Milwaukee, the Cathedral is downtown and across the street from a park where many homeless people stay. Many of these “little ones” make their way in and out of the cathedral throughout the day. A noon meal is provided for them. They are welcome. Do we do the same?
