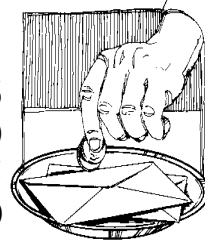

# August 1, 2010 – 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Exegesis on this Sunday's readings

*Ecclesiastes 1:2, 2:21-23 | Psalm 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17 | Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 | Luke 12:13-21*

Jesus tells a masterful parable about a rich man with a bountiful harvest in this Sunday's reading from the Gospel. In the space of the three verses in which the man contemplates his future, he refers to himself ten times without ever mentioning anyone else, much less God. In introducing this parable, Jesus warned against greed using a Greek word which implies not just a desire for more, but of basing one's security on material possessions.

The rich man probably worked hard for his wealthy storehouses. We, too, work hard for our homes and assets. We labor to take care of our future and our families. But our true labor is to be for God, open to his voice. If we are attentive to God, then all our days we will seek to do his will, know his ways, and be Jesus' disciples. Each day, we will work to restore relationships, heal our broken world, and build up God's kingdom. We will take off our old selves and put on a new one just as Paul advises!

## **Fr. John's Corner**

### *18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time...*

Jesus warns against greed, a theme prominent in Luke's gospel. He tells the parable of a man so prosperous that he builds new barns to house his abundant grain, although he is unaware that he will soon lose his life. Luke's Jesus is frustrated with the greedy designs of the human heart. From the book of Ecclesiastes we hear an ancient echo of Jesus' disparaging attitude toward materialism. All things are vanity, says Qoheleth. And for our Second Reading today, we conclude our brief series of readings from Colossians with a beautiful appeal to the spiritual life. The baptized, who were raised with Christ, should seek the things that are above.

### *Religious Education registration...*

We're continuing to accept registration of children and adults who're requesting religious education and sacramental preparation classes for the coming year. Mike Bauer, our Religious Education Coordinator, will be in the Kamiano Center today to meet all interested individuals and families and assist them with the registration process and to answer any questions about initiation rites, etc.
